Directions

1. Do all work neatly. This cannot be stressed enough. It will be difficult to read your map if it is messy, thereby rendering it useless for studying.
2. TOAD the map.
 - T = Title. Does it have a title? If not, add one.
 - O = Orientation. Does it have a compass rose? If not, add one in an inconspicuous spot.
 - A = Author. Put your name on the paper.
 - D = Date. Put the date on the paper.
3. Label bodies of water and peninsulas (see list below) in ALL CAPS. Water is shaded gray so it is easier to see.
4. Draw in mountain ranges and label them using regular case.
5. Label rivers using regular case.
6. Label deserts using regular case and shade with a light color.

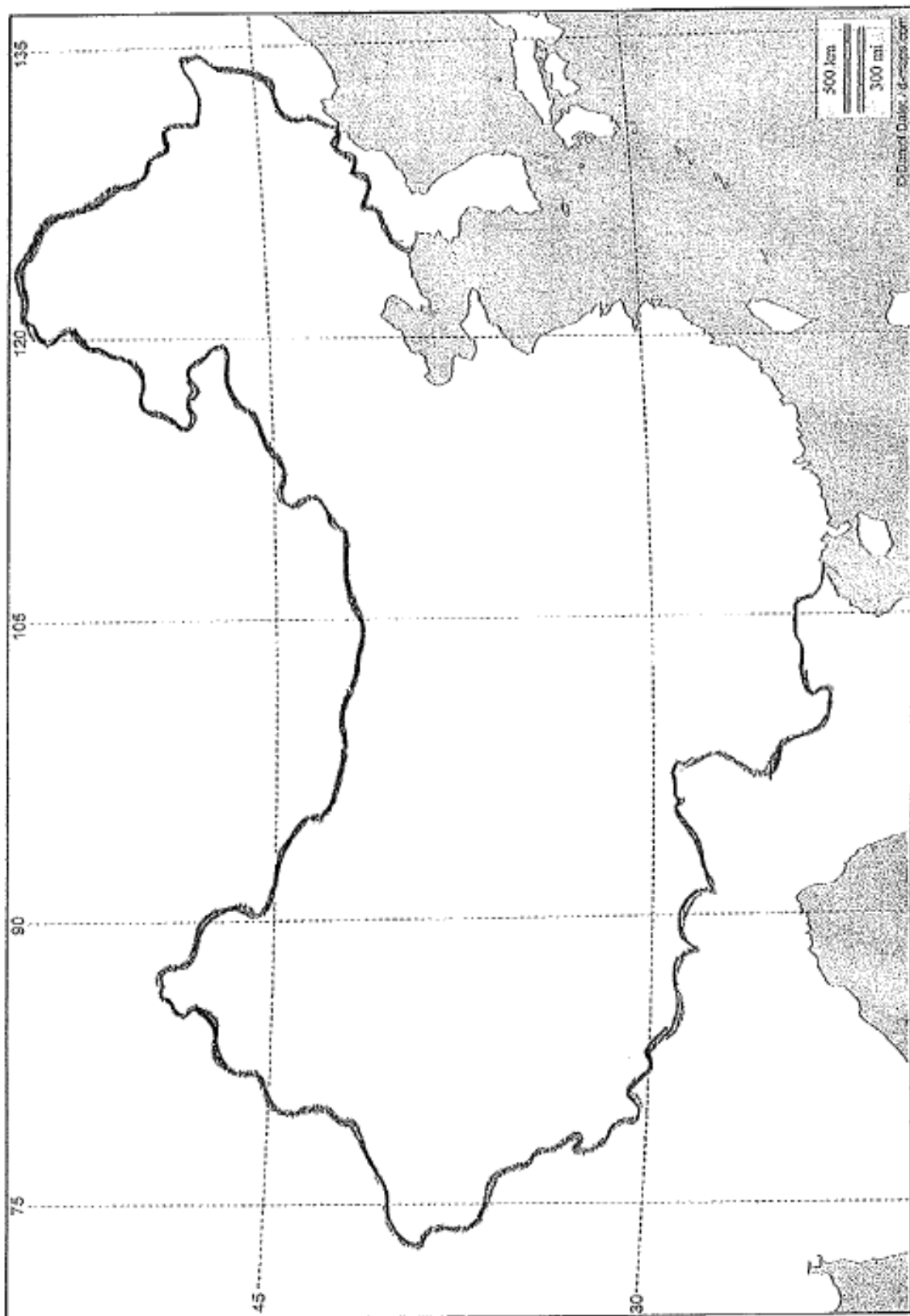
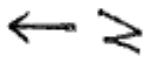
